

First Reading

Exodus 16: 2-15

The whole congregation of the Israelites complained against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness. The Israelites said to them, 'If only we had died by the hand of the Lord in the land of Egypt, when we sat by the fleshpots and ate our fill of bread; for you have brought us out into this wilderness to kill this whole assembly with hunger.'

Then the Lord said to Moses, 'I am going to rain bread from heaven for you, and each day the people shall go out and gather enough for that day. In that way I will test them, whether they will follow my instruction or not. On the sixth day, when they prepare what they bring in, it will be twice as much as they gather on other days.' So Moses and Aaron said to all the Israelites, 'In the evening you shall know that it was the Lord who brought you out of the land of Egypt, and in the morning you shall see the glory of the Lord, because he has heard your complaining against the Lord. For what are we, that you complain against us?' And Moses said, 'When the Lord gives you meat to eat in the evening and your fill of bread in the morning, because the Lord has heard the complaining that you utter against him—what are we? Your complaining is not against us but against the Lord.'

Then Moses said to Aaron, ‘Say to the whole congregation of the Israelites, “Draw near to the Lord, for he has heard your complaining.” ’ And as Aaron spoke to the whole congregation of the Israelites, they looked towards the wilderness, and the glory of the Lord appeared in the cloud. The Lord spoke to Moses and said, ‘I have heard the complaining of the Israelites; say to them, “At twilight you shall eat meat, and in the morning you shall have your fill of bread; then you shall know that I am the Lord your God.” ’

In the evening quails came up and covered the camp; and in the morning there was a layer of dew around the camp. When the layer of dew lifted, there on the surface of the wilderness was a fine flaky substance, as fine as frost on the ground. When the Israelites saw it, they said to one another, ‘What is it?’ For they did not know what it was. Moses said to them, ‘It is the bread that the Lord has given you to eat.

Second Reading

Philippians 1.21–30

For to me, living is Christ and dying is gain. If I am to live in the flesh, that means fruitful labour for me; and I do not know which I prefer. I am hard pressed between the two: my desire is to depart and be with Christ, for that is far better; but to remain in the flesh is more necessary for you. Since I am convinced of this, I know that I will remain and continue with all of you for your progress and joy in faith, so that I may share abundantly in your boasting in Christ Jesus when I come to you again.

Only, live your life in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ, so that, whether I come and see you or am absent and hear about you, I will know that you are standing firm in one spirit, striving side by side with one mind for the faith of the gospel, and are in no way intimidated by your opponents. For them, this is evidence of their destruction, but of your salvation. And this is God's doing. For he has graciously granted you the privilege not only of believing in Christ, but of suffering for him as well— since you are having the same struggle that you saw I had and now hear that I still have.

Matthew 20:1-16

'For the kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out early in the morning to hire labourers for his vineyard. After agreeing with the labourers for the usual daily wage, he sent them into his vineyard. When he went out about nine o'clock, he saw others standing idle in the market-place; and he said to them, "You also go into the vineyard, and I will pay you whatever is right." So they went. When he went out again about noon and about three o'clock, he did the same. And about five o'clock he went out and found others standing around; and he said to them, "Why are you standing here idle all day?" They said to him, "Because no one has hired us." He said to them, "You also go into the vineyard." When evening came, the owner of the vineyard said to his manager, "Call the labourers and give them their pay, beginning with the last and then going to the first." When those hired about five o'clock came, each of them received the usual daily wage. Now when the first came, they thought they would receive more; but each of them also received the usual daily wage. And when they received it, they grumbled against the landowner, saying, "These last worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us who have borne the burden of the day and the scorching heat." But he replied to one of them, "Friend, I am doing you no wrong; did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? Take what belongs to you and go; I choose to give to this last the same as I give to you. Am I not allowed to do what I choose with what belongs to me? Or are you envious because I am generous?" So the last will be first, and the first will be last.'

Announcements for September 20, 2020

Until a new Interim Priest is in place, members of the Corporation will take turns providing all of you with news about our blessed congregation. Despite Covid, there is a lot going on!

Planning for Fall Services Back in the Church! – An All Saints Steering Committee has been formed to plan for us to resume services in our beautiful church. Working in conjunction with St. Ben's, we are going through all the details and requirements to ensure that we can open in an orderly, safe and welcoming manner. We will start with the Sunday 11:00 am service, adding the 9:00 am service shortly after. We have established that the church has the capacity to accommodate our expected attendance, even with social distancing. **We will hold our first in-person service on Sunday, September 27, 2020 T 11:00 am.** Information on our plans for these services has been sent out on the website and by mail to those without internet. There is also a video with Bishop Don and the two Wardens talking about our plans that you can watch on our website or using this link: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=dc3kx51apiE&feature=youtu.be>. It will be wonderful to see each other again, even if it is at a bit of a distance!

On-Line Services Will Continue – Right now, Bishop Don, Dietrich and team are recording our service in parts, editing it and then uploading it to YouTube and our website. Starting this fall, we will record our services as they occur in the church on Sunday mornings and stream them to you live at 11:00 am, plus they will be available throughout the week whenever you wish to watch them. The technology is different, but you will be able to watch exactly as you are doing now, either by YouTube or at allsaintswinnipeg.ca.

Renovations on the Annex: Significant planning has been going on regarding upgrading the Annex. Work on the main floor installing a fully accessible washroom, sprucing up the Boardroom and kitchenette, installing fire-rated doors, re-doing some of the floors, ceiling and lighting will start on October 5. The work will go on until mid-January. During this time, the Annex will remain open and there will always be access to an accessible washroom. Stay tuned for more details on this exciting project in future announcements.

Meeting with Bishop Geoff – On Tuesday, July 21, Corporation members met with Bishop Geoff and Archdeacon Simon Blaikie to discuss the process to recruit a new priest for All Saints. Following are the highlights of that important meeting:

- o The Bishop informed us that Bishop Don has agreed to continue as an Honorary

Assistant at All Saints. He is willing to preside and preach as mutually agreeable and provide emergency pastoral care. All members of Corporation expressed how thankful they are for Bishop Don's help, advice and taking of services.

o Bishop Geoff proposed that he look for a Priest who would start with a term of 12+ months but who could be made a permanent Incumbent at the end of his interim term if the Bishop, the congregation and the interim appointee all agreed.

o A notice and description of our congregation has been sent out. It could be three+ months before anyone is in place, particularly given that we are starting recruitment in the middle of summer (and Covid).

 - A current copy of your Certified Income Summary issued by CRA is mandatory in order to qualify for the discount.
 - Provide Government issued photo I.D such as a driver's license or passport.
 - Provide a copy of your Manitoba Health Card if you have dependent(s).
 - Provide your last landlord's contact information in order for the office to do a reference check.
 - \$25.00 credit check fee must be paid in advance before we will process your application.
- If you have a recent copy (within the last 8 weeks) you may provide the office a copy of that document.

- International Students must provide a study permit as well as 3 months of printed bank statements. Bank statements must show deposits and current balance.
- Unverifiable income will NOT be considered.
- In cases where rent will be more than 30% of income, a co-signer will be requested.
