First Reading

Exodus 12: 1-14

The Lord said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt: This month shall mark for you the beginning of months; it shall be the first month of the year for you. Tell the whole congregation of Israel that on the tenth of this month they are to take a lamb for each family, a lamb for each household. If a household is too small for a whole lamb, it shall join its closest neighbour in obtaining one; the lamb shall be divided in proportion to the number of people who eat of it. Your lamb shall be without blemish, a year-old male; you may take it from the sheep or from the goats. You shall keep it until the fourteenth day of this month; then the whole assembled congregation of Israel shall slaughter it at twilight. They shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and the lintel of the houses in which they eat it. They shall eat the lamb that same night; they shall eat it roasted over the fire with unleavened bread and bitter herbs. Do not eat any of it raw or boiled in water, but roasted over the fire, with its head, legs, and inner organs. You shall let none of it remain until the morning; anything that remains until the morning you shall burn. This is how you shall eat it: your loins girded, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and you shall eat it hurriedly. It is the passover of the Lord. For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike down every firstborn in the land of Egypt, both human beings and animals; on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgements: I am the Lord. The blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you live: when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague shall destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt.

This day shall be a day of remembrance for you. You shall celebrate it as a festival to the Lord; throughout your generations you shall observe it as a perpetual ordinance.

Announcements – September 6, 2020

With Brent's retirement, members of the Corporation will take turns providing all of you with news about our blessed congregation. Despite Covid, there is a lot going on!

Planning for Fall Services Back in the Church! – An All Saints Steering Committee has been formed to plan for us to resume services in our beautiful church. Working in conjunction with st bens, we are going through all the details and requirements to ensure that we can open in an orderly, safe and welcoming manner. We will start with the Sunday 11:00 am service, adding the 9:00 am service shortly after. We have established that the church has the capacity to accommodate our expected attendance, even with social distancing. We would like to start near the end of September; however, a number of steps have to be taken before then, including applying to the Diocese and receiving approval to open. Stay tuned for more information on our opening date and the protocols that each of us will have to follow. It will be wonderful to see each other again, even if it is at a bit of a distance!

On-Line Services Will Continue – Right now, Bishop Don, Dietrich and team are recording our service in parts, editing it and then uploading it to YouTube and our website. Starting this fall, we will record our services as they occur in the church on Sunday mornings and stream them to you live at 11:00 am, plus they will be available throughout the week whenever you wish to watch them. The technology is different, but you will be able to watch exactly as you are doing now, either by YouTube or at allsaintswinnipeg.ca.

A Farewell for Brent – A number of you have indicated that you would appreciate an opportunity to say good-bye to Brent. We understand that, for some, this is an important part of gaining closure with his departure. An informal, purely voluntary, event has been organized for Sunday afternoon, September 13 from 2:00-4:00 pm at the Robert A Steen Community Centre, 980 Palmerston Avenue in Wolseley. You are invited to drop in to chat with Brent and have a coffee, plus individually wrapped refreshments. Masks will need to be worn (extras will be available if anyone forgets) and the Centre requires that you sign a form as you enter to facilitate Covid tracing if necessary.

Meeting with Bishop Geoff – On Tuesday, July 21, Corporation members met with Bishop Geoff and Archdeacon Simon Blaikie to discuss the process to recruit a new priest for All Saints. Following are the highlights of that important meeting:

- o The Bishop informed us that Bishop Don has agreed to continue as an Honorary Assistant at All Saints. He is willing to preside and preach as mutually agreeable and provide emergency pastoral care. All members of Corporation expressed how thankful they are for Bishop Don's help, advice and taking of services.
- o Bishop Geoff proposed that he look for a Priest who would start with a term of 12+ months but who could be made a permanent Incumbent at the end of his interim term if the Bishop, the congregation and the interim appointee all agreed.
- o A notice and description of our congregation has been sent out. It could be three+ months before anyone is in place, particularly given that we are starting recruitment in the middle of summer (and Covid).

Help with Church Expenses: Unfortunately, the costs associated with running a parish continues, which means it is important that we try and maintain our weekly offering to the church. The request from both the Treasurer and Corporation is to reach out to our community and remind them of this ongoing need. If you would like to be put on preauthorized payments it will make your efforts much more seamless. We can provide the forms to make this happen. Simply contact the office and someone will get back to you.

Organ Restoration: The first stage of restoration work to our wonderful Casavant Freres pipe organ is now complete. The work concentrated on the Swell division and entailed removal of significant parts that were refurbished in the Casavant factory in St. Hyacinthe QC. Some work was also completed on the pedal division and the hiss of escaping air we all became accustomed to has now been remedied. Dr. Dietrich Bartel is extremely pleased with the outcome and we all look forward to the next stages at a future date.

News for those interested in renting a unit in West Broadway Commons: WBC will be open for tenants starting in December 2020. While marketing with official rental rates will not start until the fall, you can put your name on a waiting list by emailing our Property Manager, Crystal Wels at c.wels@uwinnipeg.ca if you think you would be interested. Please make sure to say that you are part of our congregation. There is a lot of early demand for the affordable suites, in particular, and units will be allocated on a first-come, first-served basis, so get your name in quickly. If you are interested in an affordable suite, you will have to be prepared to provide the following information:

- Each adult (18+) years of age must complete the application form.
- Provide verification of your income such as the last two pay stubs or a confirmation letter from your current employer or budget letter.
- A current copy of your Certified Income Summary issued by CRA is mandatory in order to qualify for the discount.
- Provide Government issued photo I.D such as a driver's license or passport.
- Provide a copy of your Manitoba Health Card if you have dependent(s).
- Provide your last landlord's contact information in order for the office to do a reference check.
- \$25.00 credit check fee must be paid in advance before we will process your application. If you have a recent copy (within the last 8 weeks) you may provide the office a copy of that document.
- International Students must provide a study permit as well as 3 months of printed bank statements. Bank statements must show deposits and current balance.
- Unverifiable income will NOT be considered.
- In cases where rent will be more than 30% of income, a co-signer will be requested.
